- The event is a **USA Judo National Referee Examination Site**. Examiners: Edson Mallo, Bruce Larkins, TBA
- **Registration, Check-in, and Weigh-in procedures:** Athletes may register and weigh-in on Friday evening OR may send in a completed entry package and weigh-in on Saturday morning. **NO REGISTRATION WILL BE ACCEPTED ON SATURDAY. ONLY WEIGH-IN WILL BE CONDUCTED.** Refer to the details provided elsewhere in this package.
- **Schedule:** Seniors and Masters in the morning; Juniors (Standard and Novice) in the afternoon.
- **HOTEL HEADQUARTERS DoubleTree Hotel Denver North, 8773 Yates Drive, Westminster, CO 80031.** This is a business class facility and is a short drive from the Tournament site. A free shuttle from the hotel to the venue will be provided. Rates are \$92.00 per night (up to 4 persons per room). Deadline for reservations at this rate is April 17, 2012. Call the Hotel at 303-262-5073 and ask for the "Judo Tournament Rate." **Added Value!** Included is a full hot breakfast buffet for up to four persons per room.
- **NEW: Lower entry fees (see next page)!**
- **NEW: Entry fees will be waived for the 1st and 2nd place winners of the Senior Elite divisions from the 2011 Northglenn Judo Championships if they register by the early registration deadline. 1st and 2nd place winners of the Senior Elite divisions this year will have their entry fee waived next year.**
- **Kata competition** (Nage-no-kata and Katame-no-kata) will be conducted. Contact: Barry Hoffman – 303-926-7882.
- **Elite Tournament:** This is the 9th year that the Northglenn Championship is a **USA Judo Senior-E-level event**. Refer to the rules and explanation elsewhere in this entry package for additional details.
- **Draw:** The draw for the **Senior ELITE** will be on Friday evening. In addition, the Texas Match Scheduling System will be used. Each division will be assigned to a mat and all matches on that mat will be consecutively numbered so that players will know their first, and subsequent, match numbers.
- **There will be a Novice Senior Category** for athletes below brown belt (no elite points will be awarded).
- **The Guy Towle Memorial Award:** An annual award created in honor of our hero, Guy Towle, who throughout his life taught us the true spirit of Judo. It will be presented at noon to the Outstanding Player of the Year from Northglenn Judo Club - selected by Northglenn's Coaching Staff.
- **A Grand Championship, open to the medalists in the Senior Elite divisions** will be held at the conclusion of the Senior Elite competition. **\$250 for the Grand Champion and \$100 for the Grand Champion runner up** will be awarded to each of the Male and Female winners. Registration for the Grand Championship will be on Saturday. No entry fee; No weigh-in. 5 player minimum. If less than 5 players, prizes will be reduced accordingly. Note: this is not the Open Division which will be competed during the regular competition.
- **Most Points Award:** Excluding the host club, **\$200 to the Colorado Club** with the most points and **\$200 to the non-Colorado Club** with the most points (Gold = 5, Silver = 3, Bronze = 1. Tie-breaker: Most gold; then silver; then most bronze.)
- **Referee Seminar:** Friday 6:00 PM – 10:00 PM at the Headquarters Hotel, hosted by Noboru Saito, Olympic Referee, former USA Judo Referee Commission chairperson and current Referee Director, USA Judo Board of Directors. - **COACHES meeting and REFEREES meeting** just prior to the beginning of competition. Coaches and Referees should attend this meeting for briefing on any new rules, and tournament-specific rules and procedures.

No weigh-in is required for **Senior Elite Open division. No entry fee for Grand Champion competitors

***The discount is applied to entry fee based on the time of registration, i.e. if registration for the 2nd, 3rd, etc. division is sent in On-Time, then the discount is taken off the On-Time entry fee; similarly, if the registration is sent in Late or is a Walk-up, then the discount is taken off the Late or Walk-up entry fees.

Rules for competing in multiple categories/divisions

Athletes may compete in multiple categories if they meet the eligibility requirements for those Categories.

Examples: Junior and Senior / Junior and Kata / Junior, Senior and Kata / Senior, Kata, and Masters / etc.

Senior Athletes may compete in Senior-Novice or Senior Elite, but not in both. The same applies to Juniors.

Senior Elite Athletes may compete in one weight division and the Open.

Kata athletes may compete in both Nage-no-kata and Katame-no-kata

Athletes must submit a **SEPARATE** entry form and fee for **EACH** division.

TOURNAMENT ENTRY CHECKLIST

Be sure that the following items are included when mailing in your entry package.

Keep this page for your reference; **DO NOT** mail it in with your entry form(s).

- A separate, properly completed, entry form, for **each division** you wish to enter.
- Appropriate entry fee for each division. Refer to the above section for entry fees and discounts.
- On the entry form, be sure to check the box indicating whether you intend to weigh-in on Friday evening or Saturday morning (**Senior Elites must declare a weight division AND MAKE THAT WEIGHT, if weighing in on Saturday.**)
- Proof of membership, with insurance in force, in one of USA Judo (USJI), USJF, or USJA.
NOTE: In order to receive USA Judo elite points, an athlete must be a member in good standing of USA Judo.
- Properly completed and signed **WAIVER AND RELEASE OF LIABILITY AND AGREEMENT TO PARTICIPATE.**

PLEASE MAKE SURE TO BRING YOUR CURRENT PROOF OF MEMBERSHIP/INSURANCE CARD WITH YOU TO REGISTRATION, EVEN IF YOU SENT A COPY.

IF YOU WANT CONFIRMATION THAT YOUR ENTRY MATERIALS HAVE BEEN RECEIVED AND ARE IN ORDER, ENCLOSE A STAMPED, SELF-ADDRESSED ENVELOPE WITH YOUR ENTRY PACKET.

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Elite “Point” Divisions Rules and Procedures:

Elite Point procedures: This event is a USA Judo E-level event. The **ONLY** divisions in which points can be earned are the SENIOR divisions that include ranks THROUGH black belt. ALL players who place 1st or 2nd will receive 1.0 and 0.5 SENIOR points, respectively, and Senior E-level classification. Junior-age athletes (born 1993 and later) who place 1st, 2nd, or 3rd in those same SENIOR divisions will receive 2.0, 1.0, and .5 JUNIOR points, respectively, on both the IJF Junior and their age-appropriate rosters, **in addition** to Senior points. **Restrictions:** In order to receive points, players must be citizens of the USA. In addition, players must win at least 1 match to receive SENIOR points (the 1 win restriction does not apply for JUNIOR points). **In order to be awarded points, a player must join USA Judo before competition begins.**

Seeding: For the Elite point categories, the top 4 nationally ranked Senior athletes will be seeded if they compete in the weight division in which they are ranked. #1 and #4 shall be placed on one side of the bracket; #2 and #3 shall be placed on the other side. The seeding order shall be in the order of the byes, i.e., if there is 1 bye, #1 shall get it; if there are 2 byes, #'s 1 and 2 shall get them, etc. If any of the top 4 nationally ranked athletes are not in attendance, athletes ranked #5 and below SHALL NOT be seeded, i.e., “moved up” to the next higher seed position.

Rules for the Elite point categories:

1. **BLUE GIS ARE REQUIRED.**
2. IJF contest rules shall be used, including “Golden Score” overtime.
3. Players may compete in only 1 weight division AND, optionally, the Open division.
4. Players must compete in the weight category that conforms to their measured weight at weigh-in.

Example: A player competing in the 81 kg division must weigh over 73 kg and less than or equal to 81 kg. **Exceptions:** 1) The Male 55 kg and Female 44 kg divisions are PJU weights and not “Olympic” weights. Competitors whose measured weight would place them in a PJU weight division may choose to compete in the next higher weight division (Male 60 kg and Female 48 kg). 2) The **Open** division has no weight restriction.

TOURNAMENT REQUESTS

➤ Judogi and belt Colors:

- Senior Elite Competitors – Both **Blue Gis** and White Gis are required as appropriate.
- Junior, Master, and Senior Novice Competitors – a blue gi is optional.
- In all cases, the “white” competitor **MUST** have a white Judogi. **Blue** Judogi’s may only be worn by the competitor who is bracketed on the blue side (note: this is now the second in a pair of contestants). Competitors will not be switched on the mat.
- In matches where both competitors are wearing white gis, both competitors will remove their grade belts and wear a blue or white belt to identify the contestant’s designated color for the match. Contestants are requested to bring their own blue and white belts for use on the “blue” or “white” side. This will ensure that the belt will fit properly. Mark the belt with the player’s name or club name. In some cases, blue sashes may be used instead.

- **Referees and Technical Officials:** Each club is requested to bring at least one referee and one volunteer to serve as a technical official (timer, scorer, etc.)

ELIGIBILITY: Open competition. All contestants must be members in good standing, with insurance in force, in one of the following national organizations: USA Judo (NGB, USJI), USJF, or USJA. If membership card is lost, Colorado Judo League can only verify USA Judo membership locally. Membership in USA Judo will be available at registration.

AWARDS

- **Individual:** Awards will be presented to the top three finishers in each division and to 4th place if a division has 8 or more participants.
- **Club:** Club awards will be presented to the two clubs with the most points based on 5 points for 1st place, 3 points for 2nd place and 1 point for 3rd place. . In case of tie, Club with most gold, then silver, then bronze medals will win. If still tied, coin toss will determine winner.
- **Grand Championship** open to medalists from the Senior Elite divisions. \$250 will be awarded to the male and female Grand Champion and \$100 to the runners up.
- Excluding the host club, **\$ 200** to the **Colorado Club** with the most points and **\$200** to the **non-Colorado Club** with the most points (Gold = 5, Silver = 3, Bronze = 1. Tie-breaker: Most gold; then most silver; then most bronze.)
- The **Guy Towle Memorial Award** will be presented.

RULES; METHOD OF ELIMINATION; COLOR OF UNIFORMS

Additional Rules and Procedures specific to Senior Class-E-/Junior Class-D divisions are located elsewhere in this package.

Current IJF rules as modified below for local competition will be in effect:

1. If a modified safety area size around the competition area is used, 1994 IJF rules for boundaries will be used.
2. Senior and Juvenile C (Male and Female): 5 min. All other Junior and Masters matches (Male and Female): 3 min
3. Junior Bantam and Intermediate Categories: Chokes and Armlocks NOT allowed
4. Junior Juvenile-A&B Category: Armlocks NOT allowed

The following elimination systems will be used:

1. More than 5 competitors: Modified Double Elimination
2. 3, 4, 5 competitors: round-robin - 2 competitors: best 2 out of 3 matches

Blue or White Judogis:

1. Senior Elite Competitors – both **Blue** and White gis are required as appropriate.
2. For all others – the "white" competitor **MUST** have a white Judogi. **Blue** Judogi's are optional and may only be worn by the competitor who is bracketed on the "blue" side in a pair of contestants. Competitors will not be switched. In matches where both competitors are wearing white gi's, both competitors will remove their grade belts and wear a blue or white belt to identify the contestant's designated color for the match. Contestants are requested to bring their own blue and white belt for use on the "blue" or "white" side. In some cases, blue sashes may be used instead.

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REGISTRATION/WEIGH-IN PROCEDURES!!!

We encourage everyone to weigh-in on Friday evening at the tournament headquarters. However, based on requests received in previous years, we are allowing athletes to weigh-in on Saturday morning as well, provided that all entry forms are submitted and fees are paid in advance.

NO NEW REGISTRATIONS WILL BE ACCEPTED ON SATURDAY.

Coaches and athletes should read the new procedures carefully. Athletes who compete in the Senior Elite (point) divisions should be aware of the special procedure for those divisions.

REGISTRATION

ALL ATHLETES must submit a fully completed entry form, including proof of current membership in one of USA Judo, USJA, or USJF and appropriate entry fee(s) by 9:00 PM, Friday, May 4, 2012, **either in person OR my mail.**

Walk-up Registration and sale of USA Judo membership will be conducted at the Tournament Hotel Headquarters, **DoubleTree Hotel Denver North**, 8773 Yates Drive, Westminster, CO 80031, between 3:00-9:00 PM, on Friday, May 4, 2012.

There will be **NO REGISTRATION** conducted at the tournament site on Saturday, May 5, 2012.

For convenience, Athletes may weigh in on either Friday evening or Saturday morning, at the locations and time given in the schedule below. However, all entry forms and fees must be submitted by 9 PM, Friday, May 4, 2012 **either in person OR by mail.** NO NEW ENTRIES WILL BE ACCEPTED ON SATURDAY!!

SPECIAL PROCEDURES FOR THE SENIOR ELITE CATEGORY

The draw for the Senior Elite divisions will be conducted Friday evening, May 4, 2012 after the close of registration (9:00 PM). This will allow the tournament to begin on time at 9:00 AM Saturday morning. Therefore, Senior Elite athletes must either weigh-in on Friday evening by 9:00 PM **OR** must declare the weight division in which he or she intends to compete on their entry form. If an athlete declares a weight division and does not weigh in Friday evening, he or she **MUST MAKE THE DECLARED WEIGHT** on Saturday morning. **NO EXCEPTIONS.**

Senior Elite athletes who have declared a weight on their entry form may still weigh-in Friday evening and their measured weight will be used to place them in the draw.

Grand Championship Registration for Senior Elite division medalists will be held during tournament on Saturday morning during which athletes may enter into, or withdraw from, the Grand Championship. Note, this is not the Open Division which will be run during regular competition.

Saturday Procedure at the Tournament Site

- Senior Elite athletes who weighed-in Friday evening will pick up their match cards.
- All other Senior Elite athletes will weigh-in and then be given their match card provided they make their declared weight.
- All other athletes who did not weigh-in on Friday evening will weigh-in during the time periods designated above.
- It is anticipated that the Masters draws will be completed by 9 AM and that Senior Novice draws will be completed by 10 AM.
- Senior and Masters Competition will begin at 9 AM; Senior Novice competition will begin as soon as a mat becomes available.
- Junior draws will be completed by 12:00 Noon. Junior Advanced competition will begin after Senior/Masters competition, but no earlier than 1:00 PM. Junior Novice competition will begin at the conclusion of Junior Advanced competition or as mats become available.

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CATEGORIES OF COMPETITION - SHIAI

Junior Advanced Eligibility: Athletes born between 1993 and 2006, inclusively.

Junior Novice Eligibility: born between 1993 and 2006, inclusively; white and yellow belts only.

ALL Divisions in Bantam 1 (born 2005) and Bantam 2 (born 2003-04) will be co-ed (composed of boys AND girls.)

Senior Elite Eligibility: Athletes 17 years old and older may enter the Senior Elite Category. In addition, athletes 15 and 16 years old who hold senior brown belt rank may enter the Senior Elite Category.

Senior Novice Eligibility: Athletes 15 years old or older and below brown belt rank may enter.

Masters Eligibility: Athletes 30 years old and older may enter the Masters Category.

NOTES for Juvenile A&B Category: An attempt will be made to keep contestants born in 1996-1997 and 1998-1999 separated, **if possible**. If this is not possible, then choking will not be allowed by any competitor in the combined division. This is so that all competitors in a given division compete under the same rules.

NOTES for Masters: Masters may be divided into additional age groups depending on the number and age range of the entrants (Old, Older, & Oldest). Divisions may be combined if all players agree in advance.

NOTICE REGARDING CHANGING, COMBINING AND MULTIPLE AGE/WEIGHT DIVISIONS

1. A competitor who **voluntarily** enters an age or weight division that is higher than his or her normal division must abide by the rules of that division. Example: A competitor whose age would normally not allow the use of chokes (or armlocks), is subject to choking (or armlock) techniques if he or she **voluntarily** enters a division where chokes (or armlocks) are allowed.

2. Contestants may enter multiple categories and in some cases, more than one division in a category. Applicable rules are contained elsewhere in this entry packet (Page 2).

Contestants who compete in multiple divisions must submit an entry form and fee for each division.

3. Senior Elite Divisions **will not** be modified. **All other age/weight divisions** (Juniors, Masters, Senior Novice) **may be modified** depending on the age and weight range of the contestants entered and after considering fairness and safety of the competitors. Coaches, competitors and parents will be advised before competition begins of any published weight category that is changed.

Any situation not covered by the above will be decided by the tournament director after considering the safety of, and fairness to, all contestants. Decisions by the TOURNAMENT DIRECTOR ARE FINAL!

Kata Competition

The Kata Competition will be conducted in accordance with the current procedures of USA Judo and Colorado Judo League. Entry rules are as follows:

Eligibility: Kata teams may be composed of Junior or Senior age athletes. Teams may be Male-only, Female-only, or Male and-Female.

Categories: Teams may enter one or both of the following Kata categories.

- 1) Nage-no-kata (5 sets)
- 2) Katame-no-kata (3 sets)

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SCHEDULE OF EVENTS

Friday, May 4 at TOURNAMENT HEADQUARTERS (DoubleTree Hotel Denver North)

3:00 PM – 9:00 PM:

Registration and Weigh-in: All Athletes who have mailed in their entry forms and fees may weigh-in during this time period. In addition, “Walk-up” registrations will be accepted during this period.

Optional weigh-in: Athletes who have submitted a completed entry form and entry fee by mail need not appear Friday evening, but may weigh-in at the tournament site Saturday morning. However, **NO NEW REGISTRATIONS** will be accepted Saturday morning because the senior elite draw will have been conducted Friday evening. **Senior Elite athletes** who take advantage of this option must declare a weight division on their entry form **and make that weight** Saturday morning.

Senior Elite Open Division Registration: Athletes who wish to compete in the Open Division must register, pay fees, and check-in according to the guidelines elsewhere in this packet. The only exception is that they need not weigh in.

PLEASE MAKE SURE TO BRING YOUR CURRENT PROOF OF MEMBERSHIP/INSURANCE CARD WITH YOU TO REGISTRATION/WEIGH-IN, EVEN IF YOU SENT A COPY.

Coach Registration: Coaches may register with tournament officials and receive floor credentials.

The 44th Annual Northglenn Championship has been designated a USA Judo National Referee Examination Site. Assigned Examiners are IJF-A referees led by Edson Mallo.

On Friday, May 4, 2012, 6-10 PM, there will a clinic, hosted by Noboru Saito, Olympic Referee, former USA Judo Referee Commission chairperson and current Referee Director, USA Judo Board of Directors. The clinic will take place at the tournament headquarters: Doubletree Hotel Denver North. Among the many items to be covered, there will be discussion of new IJF contest rules as adopted by USA Judo. A written test will be conducted by the examiners at the conclusion of the clinic. Attendance at the clinic is mandatory for National Referee candidates.

Candidates for National Referee certification must meet the following criteria and conditions.

A National Referee must:

1. be at least 18 years of age.
2. be a citizen of the USA.
3. be a Regional Referee for at least one year.
4. be a member of USA Judo (USJI)
5. have a recognized judo rank of Shodan (1st dan) or higher.

Candidates must attend the clinic, pass the written test, referee the entire event, and receive a satisfactory evaluation. National Referee candidates should bring proof of age, citizenship, rank, regional certification and USA Judo membership to the Clinic. There is a \$20 fee to take the National test and a \$10 one-time registration fee for successful National Referee candidates. Checks for national examination test fees should be made payable to "USA Judo."
